Martin Edward Daymond, age 79, passed away at his home on Thursday, February 6, 2020 after a battle with cancer. Mr. Daymond was born May 18, 1940, in Slough, England, just outside of Windsor Castle, to Albert and Elsie (New) Daymond. He and his family moved to Canada in 1956, and in 1960 while traveling to Nashville, Tennessee he met the love of his life, Betty Wimpee. They were married in 1960 and, after a short time living in Canada, they moved back to Alabama, where they settled in Guntersville and built a wonderful life together.

He worked as a banker at the The Home Bank until his retirement, and was a past president of the Guntersville Chamber of Commerce. He was also an active member of the local congregation of Jehovah's Witnesses, and always enjoyed sharing his faith with those he met.

Martin always cherished his family, and he was proud and honored to be a father, grandfather, and great-grandfather.
