



Cessel Hinton Taylor

April 7, 1920 - June 3, 2014

Cessel Hinton Taylor passed away on Tuesday, June 3, at the age of 94.

She was born in Savannah, TN, to parents, Laden and Minnie Hinton. After high school, where she was Salutatorian of her graduating class, she attended a Business College in Memphis, TN.

Cessel married her husband, Howard Anthony Taylor (Hat) at the beginning of WWII. They lived in Memphis, TN, for a number of years. They eventually moved to Arab, AL, when her husband was transferred to the Redstone Arsenal. She worked for several financial institutions including the First National Bank. In the 1950's, they moved with their two children, Rhonda and Paul, to Gunterville, where they built a house on one of the first lake lots in Meadowwood. She and her family enjoyed boating and spending time on the lake.

Some of her other interests included square dancing with the Lake City Twirlers, and being a member of the Meadowwood Garden Club. She also enjoyed traveling with her husband, family and friends. She was a long time member of the First Presbyterian Church.

She was preceded in death by her husband of sixty-nine years, Howard Taylor, her daughter, Rhonda Taylor Bains, and two brothers Columbus and

Edwin Hinton. She is survived by her son Paul Taylor (Susan), grandchildren, Jennifer Moore (Jason), Beth Kennedy, Jenna Taylor and Forrest Taylor, and great grandchildren, Kendall and Jackson Moore and Reece George.

The funeral is scheduled for Saturday, June 7th at the Guntersville First Presbyterian Church with the Rev. Mark Knowles officiating. Visitation will be in the church sanctuary from 10:00 a.m. – 11:00 a.m., with the memorial service at 11:00 a.m. following the visitation.
